- Foundation in general addiction medicine with a unique concentration in complex obstetric care
- Multidisciplinary faculty from the Grayken Center for Addiction and Project RESPECT (Boston Medical Center's nationally-recognized perinatal substance use disorder treatment program)
- Prepares future leaders for careers in the emerging field of Obstetric-Addiction Medicine
- Option for individualized graduate-level research training

- Completion of OB/GYN Residency and ABOG Board Eligible
