



**Chief, The Stanford Gynecology Service
Department of Obstetrics and Gynecology, Stanford University**

The Stanford Division of Gynecology in the Department of Obstetrics and Gynecology at Stanford University seeks an exceptional physician leader for a full-time faculty position as the Chief of Gynecology, at the rank of Associate Professor or Professor in the Medical Center Line (MCL) or Clinician Educator Line (CE). The major criteria for faculty appointment in the MCL is excellence in the overall mix of scholarly activity that advances clinical medicine, clinical care, clinical teaching, and institutional service—appropriate to the programmatic need the individual is expected to fill. The major criterion for appointment for Clinician Educators is excellence in the overall mix of clinical care, teaching, administration and/or scholarship appropriate to the programmatic need the individual is expected to fulfill. Candidates should have an MD, DO or equivalent and be board certified in Obstetrics and Gynecology.

We are seeking a person who combines proven leadership skills in team building, program development and process improvement. The ideal candidate will have a record of outstanding academic accomplishment, dedication to excellence in clinical care, clinic operations, teaching and/or research, and the creative vision to help shape the future of a dynamic, growing, and progressive division. Candidates must be board certified by the American Board of Obstetrics & Gynecology.

The Stanford Gynecology Division is comprised of several service lines including General Obstetrics & Gynecology, Pediatric and Adolescent Gynecology, Sexual Medicine, Minimally Invasive Surgery, Family Planning, and FPRMS. This busy Service experienced over 12,000 patient-visits (approximately one-third new) at the on-campus Blake Wilbur Clinic and several satellite sites. Innovative programs are implemented through the Service such as the Stanford Fibroid Center a joint venture with Interventional Radiology, and the Pelvic Health Center, a comprehensive multidisciplinary program. The Gynecology Chief will work with leadership to develop a comprehensive healthy aging program and multi-disciplinary LGBTQ+ program. There are numerous academic opportunities at Stanford, including basic, translational & clinical research programs, and fellowships in Family Planning and FPRMS are hosted by their respective sections.

Stanford offers an excellent compensation plan and benefits package which includes generous housing, retirement, and dependent tuition assistance programs. Stanford is at the heart of an exciting and innovative environment, and the Department is a friendly and collegial place to work.
